




Would you go to UNM again? - Spring 2018




Post graduation plans - Spring 2018

"Recent rankings compiled by Business Insider listed The University of New Mexico as one of the most underrated colleges in the United States. To compile the ranking, Business Insider evaluated several career and outcome-based metrics for each of the schools – including cost of attendance and financial aid, career outcomes and overall return on investment. Schools were given a score out of 100 for each of those metrics and were rewarded for scoring better on those measures than on traditional rankings from publications like U.S. News and World.

UNM was overall ranked top 21 in the nation of underrated colleges in America with an overall score of 91.7, a career outcome score of 85, cost and financial aid score of 99 and a return on investment score of 91.

Student Loan Hero also vouched for the UNM, ranking New Mexico no. 2 in the nation where college pays off with a return on investment of 151 percent. New Mexico is ranked as having the third-lowest cost for college in the nation with an average cost of \$34,945 for a bachelor's degree. In New Mexico, earning a bachelor's results in a 68 percent pay increase for the average worker – meaning a student's investment is paid off in only two years."

Among all MDs licensed in New Mexico (data pulled from *School of Medicine Location Report 2018*)

- There were 1928 UNM-trained MDs licensed to practice in New Mexico in 2017 (Table 2A)
- Approximately 38% of all physicians licensed in New Mexico trained at UNM (1928/4884, Table 2A)
- UNM-trained MDs are licensed to practice in 28 of New Mexico’s 33 counties (Figure 5)

Among all MDs trained at UNM School of Medicine

- 24% of MDs trained at UNM are licensed to practice in New Mexico (1928/8139)
- 19% of MDs who graduated from UNM’s medical school are licensed to practice medicine in New Mexico (404/2115)
- 19% of MDs who completed their residency at UNM are licensed to practice medicine in New Mexico (933/4889)
- 52% of MDs who attended both medical school and completed their medical residency at UNM are licensed to practice in New Mexico (591/1135)

2017 Specialty Information

- 45% of all UNM-trained MDs in New Mexico are licensed to practice in the primary care specialties of Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, Obstetrics & Gynecology, or Pediatrics (867/1928)
- 22% of UNM-trained MDs in New Mexico are licensed to practice in one of four specialties: Anesthesiology, General Surgery, Emergency Medicine, or Psychiatry (429/1928)





NES TEST PASS RATES: 2015-2016 AND 2016-2017

The table below includes NES Competency and Content Test scores for students who completed at UNM in 2015-2016 or 2016-2017.

NES test scores were received from NMPED on February 23, 2018.

Pass rates are based on the test-taker’s best attempt.

Pass rates for the state of NM were downloaded from Pearson on April 26, 2018.



EMPLOYER SURVEYS

UNM asks employers of UNM College of Education graduates to respond to a survey at the end of each school year.

- Employers are defined as principals or other school leaders working in New Mexico public or charter schools.
- Each principal was given the names of the teachers in their school who reported UNM as their preparation institute and had been licensed in the last three years. This information was obtained by submitting a request to the New Mexico Public Education Department. In many cases, schools had more than one principal identified, and the survey was sent to all principals.



Employers were asked, based on their experience with UNM Graduates, to what extent they would recommend hiring a UNM Graduate. This question is measured on a 5-point scale where 1 represents “not at all” and 5 represents “Exceptional”.

*To what degree would you recommend hiring graduates from UNM’s College of Education?
Not at all = 1; Minimal = 2; Moderate = 3; High = 4; Exceptional = 5*

Employers were asked 48 questions regarding teacher performance that were created to be in alignment with the NMTEACH rubrics currently being used to evaluate practicing educators. These are measured on a 5-point scale where 1 represents “ineffective” and 5 represents “exemplary”.

SUMMARY

Highlights of Institutional Experience and Satisfaction

This chart summarizes findings from four different reports within our Institutional Report for ease of comparison using the same criteria surveyed.

In almost every category listed below, there were a significantly higher percentage of alumni reporting who said that the skill was important in their profession or work life. In other words, although alumni reported that CFA had helped them in varying degrees to develop these professional skills and abilities, there was a far greater need identified after graduation to develop these skills and abilities during their fine arts college experience. Graduates indicated awareness and appreciation of value of skills that CFA had helped them develop once they were in the workforce.
